

I would like to take a moment to recognize Linda Mulford, the person who really inspired me to take an interest in preserving the history of Huntington Congregational Church. Lin had a passion for history in general, it was her work and her love. Because of that and her love for this church she encouraged me to help her organize the wonderful memories we have in print about our church's history. She felt it would be a good idea to share the history of our church with the membership and thus this column was born. Lin, I dedicate this column to you and hope to honor you going forward. Thank you for all your service to HCCUCC! Linda Mulford, Historian Emeritus – named 2024.

It is interesting to reflect on the condition in Repton in 1724. King George I was the undisputed ruler of the land. George Washington was not to be born for another eight years. Native Americans were commonly encountered, and many colonists feared an armed uprising. The "commons" which evolved into Huntington Green, was used for militias "training days." Every male between 15 and 60 was considered to be part of the local militia. By law, everyone in the militia had to keep his gun, sometimes called the "Queen's Arm," in a state of constant readiness.

As we continue through our journey of celebrating our 300th anniversary, we should keep in mind the rich history that brought us to this place. We truly do have a great deal to celebrate and be so proud of accomplishing!
