TRUSTEES: Discussed many spring maintenance items. Of interest is – Spring clean-up will be May 4th. They will also be repairing the neighbor's fence posts that day. Also, they were advised that there was a scam posted on Facebook on Easter weekend regarding a craft fair at HCC and several people phoned to inquire about it. One in particular said she paid the money and asked to participate. Rev. Lucille acted quickly, posting a notice on the website and called Shelton Police to notify them.

CHRISTIAN ED: 5 more classes left -2 in April, 2 in May and one in June. Thanks to Jenny for a good job with Palm Sunday handing out of the palms. Kirsten Keith will be available in the childcare room the first Sunday of each month if anyone would like to leave their children with her.

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP: On March 31st 15 women gathered to make 45 health kits and 50 school kits – organized by Lois Ricker. Corned Beef dinner netted about \$300, and it was decided to round up the donation to the Operating Fund to \$500. The clam chowder sales netted \$568 – funds going to the RH fund. The shredding event will be on Saturday, April 20th. Need men to help direct the traffic. Left message for Nadine at Spooner House that they would be bringing food down after the event. They will be doing Mother's Day flowers again. Tag sale will be June 8th - \$20 for a space. She will check with Schuyler Wells to be sure they are not working on the construction site that weekend. Soren will send an email to the men's group to see if they can do hot dogs on the grill that day. Bob Sember volunteered to direct traffic at the shredding event.

PASTOR: Status on the new computers for Lucille and Karen – they are waiting until after Easter and the Anniversary service to get new ones to avoid any glitches. The Capital Campaign envelopes need to be stuffed after the meeting – extra hands needed to help. The service is set for Sunday. Senator Blumenthal, Mayor Mark Lauretti, Rev. Paul Atkins, the historian from the Stratford Congregational Church, Rev. Darrell Goodwin, and Rev. Margret Hoffmeister will be present.

Letters from Rep. Jim Himes, Rev. John Collins, Rev. Lance Dallaire, Rev. Sue Scott, and Senator Chris Murphy will be read. Lay leaders will be Soren Ibsen, Laura Salvio and Sue Schmitt. Deb DeMusis will play 2 Bach pieces and the same hymns from the Jan 18th service will sung but accompanied by the organ. First two pews will be reserved for dignitaries.

TREASURER: Money is doing fine. Andy went up into the Reuman House attic to purge old files for the shredding event.

He did ask if anyone is available on Wednesdays to move the recycling bin at least up the mailboxes. Karen can put them away from there.

<u>Soren Ibsen – update on the Bishop property:</u> A lot of work up there. He will get a schedule from Schuyler on when the parking lot will be emptied. A lot of interest in where the houses will be located. May 10 or 11 is the next quarterly payment from them. No word from Primrose – Dominic Thomas was to contact them to settle. Primrose's attorney said they have no money. Offered to settle for \$7500 – Soren said no. He countered with \$12,000 - If not then subpoenas will be issued.

DID YOU KNOW?

Huntington Congregationals third meeting house, a classic New England edifice dedicated in 1933, burned to the ground on July 25. 1892. A brand new church, the one standing today, was dedicated exactly one year after the fire, which was quite an achievement.

The late Helen Upton, church historian, made this statement in 1955. "Their building, one of pleasing architecture burnt down. The soil on the farms had become poor and science had not taught them reclamation and conservation. Most of the work was done by human labor helped by horses and oxen. Many young people were moving to the cities where they could earn more in the factories. There were no automobiles, so city workers could not live in the country. As a result, man's homes were deserted. It was a time when congregations were splitting into various denominations, leaving each church with few members. Nevertheless, our folks built this present structure."
